Purpose

Physician leadership is more important than ever in our rapidly changing, complex healthcare system. The Moran Eye Center is uniquely positioned to prepare residents to be physician leaders because of: strong faculty, resources, national position as a leader in ophthalmology, and excellent residents. Organizing these resources into a formal curriculum will allow residents to take more full advantage of these opportunities and will prepare the next generation of physician leaders from the Moran Eye Center.

Format

- We will have one-hour sessions on the first Tuesday of every month from 5:30-6:30pm.
- Tacos will be provided.
- These sessions will incorporate all of the non-clinical sessions that the residents are expected to attend.
- The sessions should be interactive. Potential formats include, but are not limited to: journal clubs, panel discussions, group activities, flipped classroom, etc.
- Each session will have a course leader. The course leader will plan the session.
- The sessions should not be identical year-to-year, the session leader should discuss with the current residents to focus on a topic that is relevant and timely.
- This curriculum will dovetail with Moran's Resident Research Curriculum created by Dr. Eileen Hwang
 - Incorporated Resident Research Curriculum will including the regularly occurring sessions:
 - October – Research Works in Progress
 - April – Prep for Resident Research Day
 - July and December – Journal Club
- This curriculum will be on a 3-year cycle and updated every 3rd year to adapt for changing needs/resident preferences
